The ESPRIX Swiss Excellence Thematic Awards 2026 recognise distinctive organisational capability in selected strategic domains.

They are grounded in the [Excellence Framework Europe \(EFE\)](#) as a shared reference framework for excellence, impact, and long-term value creation.

While the Classic Award evaluates the organisation, the Thematic Awards spotlight mature, integrated capability in specific dimensions of leadership, strategy, collaboration, sustainability, transformation, and societal impact.

The focus is not on isolated initiatives or short-term success.

It is on sustained capability.

Measurable impact.

Coherent strategic direction.

Crisis-to-Opportunity Turnaround Award

Turning disruption into lasting strength.

Crisis reveals character. True excellence goes further: it transforms disruption into durable capability. The Crisis-to-Opportunity Turnaround Award recognises organisations that emerge stronger after adversity — strategically clearer, structurally more resilient, and culturally more aligned than before. It honours leadership that replaces reactive crisis management with deliberate redesign, shared learning, and long-term renewal.

This award is not about survival. It is about transformation.

Claim: Turning crisis into capability.

This award recognises:

- Organisations that have converted major disruption into sustainable renewal and strategic clarity.
- Leaders who transform uncertainty into direction, learning, and collective ownership.
- Systems that embed adaptability, resilience, and structured reflection into daily practice.
- Results that demonstrate stronger performance, trust, and stability after the crisis than before.

Examples

From operational breakdown to resilient operating model

Severe disruption exposes structural weaknesses. Leadership redesigns processes, roles, and decision rights.

From financial pressure to strategic renewal

Instead of defensive cuts, the organisation redefines priorities and reallocates resources toward long-term value creation.

Result: A leaner, sharper, more future-ready organisation.

From cultural shock to shared ownership

Uncertainty threatens trust and engagement. Leaders involve teams in shaping the path forward.

Result: Stronger alignment, commitment, and confidence.

From reactive response to learning organisation

Crisis exposes gaps. The organisation systematically captures lessons and institutionalises improvement.

Result: Repeatable capability to handle future disruption.
